Objective:

To give a definite structure to the students' ambiguous innovative thoughts.

Description:

The session began with a brief introduction to the topic by our hosts Ms. Shraddha Patil and Mr. Pratik Nikam. This was followed by seeking the blessings of Goddess Saraswati by lighting the lamp and playing Saraswati Vandana.

The hosts then briefly introduced our Guest Speakers, Mr. Mandeep Singh Toor and Ms. Srijana Upadhaya, the members of Tinker Labs.

The session thereafter was continued by both the guest speakers, where Ms. Srijana began with discussing; about what exactly, innovation is. Furthermore, as the session continued, they busted out several myths like- Innovation doesn't always have to be High-tech, done by a lone genius or is not always be a breakthrough. They explained how innovation is a combination of desirability (of a person to create a change for betterment), viability (to develop an innovation into business) and feasibility (to make best use of technology). Also, to give a clear understanding to the students about innovations, they presented two case studies in which, case 1 was: "The story of Sam Farber" in that a man named Sam Farber transformed a classic vegetable peeler into a most convenient peeling tool for his wife with arthritis and currently is a one of the leading product & case 2 was: "Story of Rajasthan" where a water wheel was innovated by Wello that made the water carrying experience for the girls and women in rural areas of Rajasthan easier which solved the issue of girls not attending schools and easing out the chronic back pain they suffered because of carrying big pots of water. This explained how Empathize, Define, Ideate, Prototype and Test, are the steps through which innovation happens.

The speakers further continued with Design In Introducing Design Thinking and pact Movement which focuses on innovation which solves major problems in the society. They introduced the students with a video course which is a collaborative effort of Titan and Tinker labs to promote great minds and to ignite a spark of innovation within them. They further explained how this video course will help the students in their career as well as to solve a social cause and bring out the innovator in each student. They also introduced three projects — Zero Food wastage, Waste Management & Financial literacy.

Mr. Mandeep Singh Toor and Ms. Srijana Upadhaya concluded their session by giving a beautiful message at the end that stated - "For great innovations to take place, a simple idea and the ability to step in others shoes is needed". They further motivated the students to be more innovative, interactive and to be empathetic towards the society.

Objective

Description

The session was done through online via. Zoom meet, the session began with a brief introduction to the topic by our host Ms. Shivani Singh.

Objective:

- To inculcate financial literacy amongst the students
- To understand different aspects of fintech businesses
- To inculcate entrepreneurial spirit and culture among young students.

Description:

The session began with a brief introduction to the topic by our host, Ms. Mariya Suryavanshi. That was followed by seeking the blessings of Goddess Saraswati by lighting the lamp and playing Saraswati Vandana.

The host then briefly introduced our guest speakers, Mr. Nayan Kedia and Mr. Vatsal Shah, the co-founders of GoChanakya.com.

The event thereafter was continued by both guest speakers, where Mr. Vatsal began by discussing exactly what thoughts came by the name of Chanakya (a great teacher and the greatest of all time). Furthermore, as the session continued, he narrated the story of Stefanie Maria Graf, a tennis player. Later he asked questions to students how much money? Is enough money? and the students replied to his question. Also, Mr. Vatsal provided information on behavioural finance, how the left and right brains work, how the left brain is used for logic, calculations, facts-driven thinking, and mathematics, and how the right brain is used for creativity, intuition, emotion-driven thinking, and how all the decisions we take are a combination of both parts of the brain. Men are analytical thinkers, and women are emotional and intuitional thinkers.

The guest speaker further continued by talking about how we can do well with the little money we have by using it very smartly, which has a lot to do with how you behave. Further, he also provided an example of the richest men in history, John D. Rockefeller and Nikola Tesla, and how their strategic thinking helped them become the richest people in the world. Further, he told students about various biases, i.e., anchoring bias, herding bias, and confirmation bias, and he also provided various examples related to various biases and effects. He further added that social media has ruined the lives of people and is the deadliest part of confirmation bias; in total, there are 64 biases that affect us, and the brain takes the decision accordingly.

Further, an interesting activity was conducted by the guest speakers, in that all the participants were told to scan the QR code and answer the questions; at the end of the activity, individuals learned about their inner personalities. The activity was fun, interesting, and something new for everyone.

The activity conducted tells us about various different personalities, like entrepreneurs, artists, guardians, celebrities, and politicians. The guest speaker further stated a quote by Albert Einstein. "Compound interest is the eighth wonder of the world." "He who understands it, earns it; he who doesn't, pays it." He also provided information about fund management with compound interest and how it will pay off in the long run.

Mr. Vatsal also mentioned powerful images:

- **Build a tower of wealth:** -by reducing unnecessary expenses, building emergency funds, automotive investing, increasing savings, and increasing additional income.
- **Crush your dreams:** -By clearing your credit card debt, a credit card is a very useful financial tool, and we should use it very carefully.

- Start early, but it's never too late.
- Look at multiple income sources.

A reel was shown related to finance (how the new investors should analyze and study the market and then, accordingly, take decisions).

The guest speakers later answered the question asked by the students, i.e., why the name Chanakya? Because Chanakya is referred to as the "kingmaker," he empowered people, understood people, reached the last mile, gave knowledge, and also gave solutions to overcome various bias effects. They also gave information about the sub-bank and how it will affect India.

Mr. Nayan Kedia and Mr. Vatsal Shah concluded their session by giving the students an opportunity to work in their firm as interns and motivating them to start their entrepreneurial journey.


