


2. How relevant were the topics covered during the induction programme?


3. Did you find the conducted sessions beneficial?

4. How would you rate Mr. Anup Munshi's knowledge during the session "Academic Roots to Professional Wings"?




5. How would you rate Mr. Anup Munshi's presentation skills during the session "Academic Roots to Professional Wings" ?


6. How would you rate Dr. Amanpal Singh Chawla's knowledge during the session "Global Skills, Local Impact : Thriving in a competitive World"?
