



1. How would you rate the overall quality of the Alumni interaction sessions?




2. Were the alumni able to share valuable insights about their experiences and career journey?


3. How satisfied are you with the insights provided by the alumni regarding career and industry expectations?


4. How would you rate Mr. Shivang Sharma's alumni talk?


5. How would you rate Ms. Priyanka Gaikwad's alumni talk?
