



These contestants are later taken for promotional and cultural exchange program shows in Thailand, which gives them an International exposure and also boosts our India- Thai relations. This year the winner is Ms. Chandni Sharma who is from a culturally rich ,small town, Gohar in Himachal Pradesh. She is an electronics & telecommunication engineer. We visited a government public school in this small town and gifted 2 laptops to 2 bright girl students from this school. We hope that not just these 2 girls but all the students from this school will be encouraged by our gesture and take inspiration from our Indian Princess, Ms. Chandni Sharma and make it big in their lives. We also visited Martyr Capt. S. Kalia's family in Palampur (HP) to acknowledge and appreciate his supreme sacrifice for our country. Capt. Kalia was the first officer to detect and inform about the Pak intrusion while doing patrol duties in the first fortnight of May 1999. Capt. S. Kalia along with his 5 jawans were captured alive on the Indian side of LOC. On May 15th 1999 Capt. Kalia fought the real battle for 22 days undergoing the worst possible ordeal. Pak army indulged in the most heinous acts of burning bodies with cigarettes, piercing ears with hot irons, removing eyes, breaking most of the bones and teeth, chopping off various limbs and genitals of these soldiers. The enemy gave in, but these valiant sons did not break while undergoing the brutal torture. Pak army had to shoot them ultimately. A common man would shiver just to think of what happened to these soldiers.

Capt. Kalia's parents are still running from pillar to post seeking justice against this unpardonable war crime. His parent's words still reverberate in my mind- "Why can't the politicians take an oath the way an army man does to serve his country and put his country before his life? Why is, that there is no value for human lives in our country? If Indians are made of the same flesh and blood as people from other countries, why can't we Indians be sincere in our ways? Why don't we believe in being disciplined, working hard and having a right attitude? In 2011, when we had met Lt. Navdeep's parents, they said citizens of India can pay tribute to these brave sons of soil with small gestures—like performing even the most insignificant task however small, with sincerity and dedication.

The Food for thought now is, "Can we do our day- to -day work sincerely and pay tribute to our real heroes"?


