


Proud To play for Team India at Futsal U/20 World Cup -2014 Chile!!

India got qualified in the Asian qualifiers for Futsal World Cup. The selections for the under 20 Futsal World Cup took place at Andheri Sports Club. There were around 150 to 200 candidates for the Team India selections, from which only 30 players were short-listed from Mumbai and from which 12 players got selected for the Indian squad and I was one of them.

The matches were held in Chile from 18th October 2014 to 28th October 2014; around 12 countries had participated namely: Italy, Rep China, Argentina, Columbia, Curacao, Cataluña, Brazil, Australia, Paraguay, Uruguay and India.

After all the practice sessions and preparations we took off for the Futsal World Cup 2014 which took place in Concepcion Chile. The experience was pretty amazing. The consistent encouragement of Team India's Coach Aniket Sarkarinspired us to give our best. The opponents, the crowd, the Chile's mango people were very helpful, humble and sporting. We gave a tough fight to the teams of different countries. Even though we didn't make it to the knock-out stages it was a joyful experience representing Team India for the Under 20 Futsal World Cup....

Talking more about this visit, travelling and conveyance was done through a Volvo bus "Neeta Volvo" which was very much comfortable for a long 9hours journey with various stops for refreshments and eatery. Moreover we students were accompanied by two of our professors namely, Prof.Dr.Rekha Shenoy Mam and Prof.Abhay Desai Sir who were really fun to be with. To add on we were really grateful to have a stay and accommodation into a resort belonging to the executive president of our very own college Atharva Institute of Management Studies, Shri Sunil Rane Sir. He gave us an opportunity to explore Blue Ocean Resort to its fullest and live into luxurious villa's out there. We find our batch lucky enough that we students happened to receive such a huge opportunity and we are really thankful to him for the same.

Our journey started off on 22nd August early morning and we happened to reach the resort before lunch. We were then provided with a buffet lunch having an option of various meals to quench our thirst and hunger from the long journey that we had been through. After which we took the needed rest and we were asked by our professors to gather in the hall that was been allocated for the students known as activity area. Under the guidance of our professors we were made to play various management games which made the students take active part into various activities and proactively participate in the same. There were two representatives appointed among the students itself if there were any teams made up during the management games. This helped the students to interact and gel up well with each other. The various management games were decided anonymously. The students who won the management games were rewarded with small management prizes, these achievement of prizes made the students put in all their efforts and was totally based on performance linked benefits.

The very next morning at Ganpati pule (Ratnagiri) started, by heading towards the main temple which was bound by idyllic gateway that attracts peace – seekers, beach lovers and pilgrims alike. Lessons from the University Visits



On our visit to the Fudan Univ. – School of Management – discussion took place with the Officer in charge of 'INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM & COOPERATION – both for students and Faculty' and after exchanging our Brochures, it was agreed to correspond through Mails to take the concept forward.

The city of Shanghai has no newspapers in English, neither any English Magazines and only two Bookshops that sell only Chinese publications. Cosmopolitanism is obviously missing for which they do not have any regrets.

Learning from the City life:

The city of Shanghai is an 'Infrastructural Marvel'. The city which was a village only two decades before, how it has metamorphosised itself is an 'Eighth Wonder'. The Buildings, the roads, the Flyovers, the Traffic Discipline is worthy of emulating by our countrymen. The Police were nowhere to be seen but the drivers and the pedestrians just loved to follow the rules.

Every road had a 'Service Road' where only two wheelers, Cycles and pedestrians could use and this unique concept has avoided accidents and honking by cars to 'nil' status.

Summary:

The overall health of the Chinese population seemed to me' short & stout' and one of the reasons could be that there were no'sweetmeat' shops in the entire city. Sweets are strictly avoided by one and all.

This being my first exposure outside India, I sincerely thank my Seniors – Executive President Shri Sunil Rane Sir, Dean Prof. NS Rajan & Directors Dr. PP Joshi and Dr. SK Bhattacharya, for providing me this opportunity to enlarge my vision and outlook and also to make a comparative study of the two nations as to how a Nation achieves greatness.
